
League programs engender hope, confidence, and self-esteem in the youth served.

Once your activity is confirmed, the League team will ensure your volunteer day is meaningful, well-organized, and productive.


STEP 1

POLICY AND PROCEDURES


Kindly submit your project request 3-4 weeks before your desired project date.

OPERATION SCHOOL BELL

OSB PROVIDES CHILDREN WITH NEW:

- Shoes, clothing, backpacks, school supplies, grooming products, books, sweaters, socks, undergarments and a toy!
- This promotes their school attendance and selfconfidence. OSB serves more than 8,499 children in need every year

SERVICE PROJECT:

- Volunteers help assemble grooming kits and school backpacks with school supplies, clothes, books, and toys at the League Chapter House in Hollywood.
- Time commitment is usually 2 hours.
- Ideal for groups of 5 10 volunteers



OSB ON WHEELS

WHEELS DAY:

• Mobile extension of OSB that uses our 48' fully outfitted trailer to deliver services directly to students on LAUSD campuses throughout Los Angeles

SERVICE PROJECT:

- Volunteers stage the operation and staff the supply stations with the help of experienced members.
- Time commitment is 7:00 am 1:00 pm. Full Day (6 hours) or two shifts (3 hours each)
- Ideal for either one-time or ongoing volunteer groups of 5-10



FOSTER CHILDREN'S **RESOURCE CENTER**

FCRC (NORTHRIDGE):

• Foster children in crises receive clothing and supplies, giving them a fresh start and bolstering their selfesteem

SERVICE PROJECT:

- Volunteers work with League members to become personal shoppers for the children, assisting them with selections and making it a day to remember.
- Ideal for short-term volunteering for groups of 2-4 volunteers
- The time commitment is 2-3 hours per project when the Center is open: Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday.



PRESCHOOL LEARNING CENTER

PLC:

• Our nationally accredited preschool provides lowincome children with a safe, nurturing environment that promotes academic, physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development

SERVICE PROJECT:

- Assist with various activities, including craft projects, face painting, spreading holiday cheer by gifting and wrapping toys, and more!
- Ideal for one-time or ongoing volunteering for small groups of up to 8 volunteers
- All projects at the League's Preschool Learning Center in Hollywood for 1-2 hours






SPECIAL PROJECTS
