6 Programs Assistance League of Los Angeles auxiliary members volunteered 38,886 hours to support six remarkable programs. Our programs are provided free of charge to all in need:

Operation School Bell provided 4,456 children living in poverty with clothing, backpacks, school and hygiene products, promoting their school attendance and self-confidence.

Pre-School Learning Center, our nationally accredited pre-school, taught 48 low-income children and gave special holiday gifts to all the children and members of their families.

Family Service Agency brought compassionate counseling services to 299 families (587 children and 352 adults.)

Foster Children's Resource Center provided 1,705 foster children in crisis with clothing, backpacks, school supplies, hygiene supplies and books.

Hollywood Children's Club helped families living in poverty in the Hollywood vicinity with new clothing, diapers and hygiene products for 162 infants and children.

Theatre for Children brought the joy of live theatre to more than 12,500 schoolchildren from the underserved communities.

Lastly, our Court Referred Volunteer Center connected citizen volunteers with local organizations, resulting in 2,205,492 community service hours.




