Our Programs

League members volunteered 42,778 hours of their precious time to deliver programs free of charge to 20,961 children in 2018. That is 768 more youth who were served than the previous fiscal year!

Apartment 3C Bright Future Scholarships were awarded to 27 first and second-year college students who graduated from LAUSD's Homeless Education Program and Foster Youth Achievement Program, helping them toward their college degree.


Foster Children's Resource Center provided a record-high 2,133 foster children with critically needed clothing, grooming kits, books, and school supplies, boosting their self-confidence and school attendance.

Operation School Bell helped 6,741 of L.A.'s neediest children receive school clothing, shoes, grooming kits, school supplies and books, promoting their self-esteem and academic engagement.

Preschool Learning Center, accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, provided an excellent preschool education to 67 children from low-income families.

Theatre for Children Program brought the magic and joy of live musical theater to 12,000 disadvantaged and/or special needs children.

The Court Referred Volunteer Center program, the League's service enterprise, connected more than 20,000 Angelenos with local organizations to fulfill their court-mandated community service work, resulting in more than 1,547,000 volunteer hours for the City of Los Angeles.






