

# Our Programs

While our delivery methods changed due to the coronavirus pandemic, 515 League members still volunteered 23,913 hours to deliver programs free of charge to 15,150 youth. Here is a snapshot of our programs:

**Bright Future Scholarship** program funded 48 homeless and foster youth to make their college dreams come true. Scholarship awardees are funded at the same level for freshman through senior year.

Foster Children's Resource Center ("FCRC") provided 1,837 foster children with clothing, backpacks, school supplies, hygiene products and books from the Northridge facility utilizing curbside pick-up during Covid-19.

**Operation School Bell** ("OSB") partnered with other local nonprofits to deliver new clothing, backpacks, school supplies, hygiene products, books, socks, and underwear to 6,101 children during the pandemic.

**Preschool Learning Center**, our nationally accredited preschool, provided an excellent preschool education to 40 children ages 3-5 years old from low-income families

Theatre for Children program brings elementary school children from underserved communities to the Assistance League Theater for musical theater performances by the Nine O' Clock Players. Due to the pandemic, the program pivoted to produce a YouTube video series, "The Magical Theatre Experience," about theater production that was enjoyed by 7,108 viewers.

Court Referred Volunteer Center ("CRVC") program, the League's service enterprise, connected nearly 11,000 Angelenos with local organizations to generate more than 670,000 volunteer service hours for greater Los Angeles.





