While some League programs like the Foster Children's Resource Center and the Preschool Learning Center welcomed children on-site, other programs like the

Theatre for Children Program and Operation School Bell retained a virtual delivery protocol due to flare-ups of COVID-19 across L.A. County. League members, however, restarted in-person gatherings or continued with online meetings to ensure smooth program delivery and fundraising efforts. With the pandemic slowly receding, we joyfully welcomed members to the Chapter House in Hollywood for committee discussions, social time, Family Days of Service, and other activities.

After a two-year hiatus, 2022 saw a vibrant return to an in-person (with masks!) Prom Day event that provided a free pop-up shopping boutique for students experiencing homelessness or in foster care. 210 graduating high school seniors selected the prom outfit of their dreams: dress, shoes, wrap, clutch purse, jewelry, accessories, and more, at no cost!






Our Member Auxiliaries

Our Programs

Utilizing online and in-person program delivery, our members collectively devoted 21,488 hours to guarantee an unforgettable League experience for 24,299 children, teens and young adults. League program are provided free of charge and with a lot of heart!

Bright Future Scholarship provided college funding to 41 students experiencing homelessness or in the foster care system. Awardees are supported at the same financial level throughout their college career.

Foster Children's Resource Center welcomed 1,452 foster youth to their Northridge location, for "free shopping" to select clothing, school supplies, grooming kits, backpacks, books, jackets, and toys.

Operation School Bell helped 5,607 K-5th graders with new clothing, backpacks, school supplies, grooming kits, undergarments, shoes, socks, blankets, books, and toys.

Preschool Learning Center, accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, provided an excellent preschool education to 49 students.

Theatre for Children Program provided a virtual library featuring musical productions and arts enrichment, and held one in-person performance, bringing the joy of musical theater to 17,150 students.

Court Referred Volunteer Center program, the League's service enterprise, enrolled 7,774 Angelenos who provided 545,765 volunteer service hours to local organizations throughout greater Los Angeles.
